HISTORY The Life of St Francis Of Assisi

Saint Francis of Assisi, born in 1181 in Italy, was a man who profoundly embraced a life of humility and service. He was born to a wealthy family, but eventually renounced wealth and privilege, instead, he sought a deep connection with God through nature and all of creation. His experience of divine love inspired him to preach the Gospel not just through words but through actions, emphasizing the interconnectedness of all living beings.

In 1209, Francis founded the Order of Friars Minor, emphasising a life of poverty, humility, and service. He and his followers traveled to preach the Gospel, living simply and in harmony with nature. His deep compassion for all living beings earned him recognition as the patron saint of animals, symbolising his belief in the interconnectedness of creation. In his famous *Canticle of the Creatures*, Francis poetically praises elements of creation—sun, moon, wind, and water—recognizing them as siblings and reflections of God's glory. St. Francis composed *Canticle of the Creatures* (also known as *Canticle of the Sun*), when lying sick in 1224. He was being cared for by the Poor Clares at San Damiano in Assisi.

In the Canticle Francis invites all his brother and sister creatures to praise God our Creator. These creatures include "Brother Sun" and "Sister Moon," "Brother Fire" and "Sister Water," as well as "Sister Earth our Mother," who sustains us. It is said that the final verse praising Sister Death was added by Francis in 1226, shortly before he died.

Francis' teachings and lifestyle inspired countless individuals and movements, emphasising love, peace, and stewardship of the environment.



Saint Francis' life and teachings encourage humanity to respect and protect the environment, reminding us that caring for creation is a way of honouring the Creator. Through his example, he invites us to recognise the sacredness in the world around us, urging us to live in harmony with all creatures, fostering peace and stewardship in our shared home. His legacy continues to inspire ecological awareness and spiritual reverence today.

Saint Francis of Assisi profoundly influenced Pope Francis, who adopted his namesake to emphasise care for the environment and the marginalised. In his encyclical "Laudato Si'," Pope Francis echoes Francis' reverence for creation, calling for ecological responsibility and social justice. 



Reflections: War On Creation

The prophet Isaiah portrays a desolate Creation, devoid of peace due to injustice and the broken relationship between God and humankind "Peace is more than just the absence of war. In the Hebrew Bible, shalom represents a far deeper concept—one that extends beyond the absence of conflict to the full restoration of broken relationships, as illustrated in Isaiah's vision. This restoration encompasses our relationship with God, ourselves, the human family, and the rest of Creation."


"The Spirit guides us to ecological conversion and a deeper understanding of our cosmic family. We must change our mindsets, embrace righteousness, and teach these values to future generations."
