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
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Who is St. Francis of Assisi

We celebrate St. Francis of Assisi feast day on October 4 th.



St. Francis showed love to all people **especially the poor** . He treated all people equally.

St. Francis of Assisi composed a poem or hymn named Canticle of the Creatures (also known as Canticle of the Sun), when lying sick in 1224. In this hymn he invites all his brother and sister creatures to LOVE and PRAISE God our Creator. Every verse of the Canticle begins with PRAISE.

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These creatures include "Brother Sun" and "Sister Moon," "Brother Fire" and "Sister Water," as well as "Sister Earth our Mother," who sustains us. The final verse praising "Sister Death" was added by Francis in 1226, shortly before he died.

Praised be You, my Lord, through our Sister Mother Earth, who sustains and governs us, and who produces various fruit with colored flowers and herbs

Praised be You, my Lord, through those who give pardon for Your love, and bear infirmity and tribulation. Blessed are those who endure in peace for by You, Most High, shall they be crowned.

Praised be You, my Lord, through our Sister Bodily Death, from whom no one living can escape. Woe to those who die in mortal sin. Blessed are those whom death will find in Your most holy will, for the second death shall do them no harm. Praise and bless my Lord and give Him thanks and serve Him with great humility. Take part in an exhibition to showcase artistic reflections on the Canticle or a specific verse of the Canticle.


Submit either a painting/drawing, photograph, sculpture, video, song, poetry, dance and prayer.





















