



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

### 1. What is Call on Canvas 2026?

- An archdiocesan art competition inviting young people to proclaim the Good News through creative expression rooted in faith and personal reflection.

### 2. What is the theme?

- “Proclaim His Goodness.” All artwork must clearly communicate your personal experience or understanding of God’s goodness.

### 3. Who can participate?

- Persons aged 11-35 who are residents of Trinidad and Tobago.

### 4. What are the categories?

Participants are grouped into:

- Young Artists (11-17)
- Emerging Artists (18-35)
- Professional Artists

### 5. What types of artwork are accepted?

- Fine Art (drawing/painting)
- Mixed Media
- Digital Art & Photography



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

6. How many pieces can I submit?

- One entry per participant.

7. What are the size requirements?

- Artwork must be:
- No smaller than legal size (8.5 x 14 inches)
- No larger than 3 ft x 3 ft

8. What must I do to be eligible?

You must:

- Submit entry form and payment
- Attend the In Person Workshop
- Submit artwork and documents

9. What is required for submission?

- Completed entry form (attached to package, not artwork)
- Artist Statement (100-150 words)
- Proper packaging (sealed and protected)



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

10. When is the deadline?

- September 10, 2026.

11. Is AI-generated artwork allowed?

- No. All submissions must be entirely original.

12. What could lead to disqualification?

- Plagiarism or non-original work
- Failure to follow guidelines
- Inappropriate content (violence, profanity, etc.)

13. Will my artwork be exhibited?

- Yes. All artwork will be exhibited unless you request otherwise.

14. Do I keep ownership of my work?

- Yes. Artists retain ownership, but grant permission for non-commercial use (with credit).
